No, that's not the beginning of a bad joke; it's the name of a campaign to engage the Jewish community in an effort to stem global warming.

The Coalition on the Environment and Jewish Life and the Jewish Council for Public Affairs on Monday announced the campaign, also known as "A Light Among the Nations." The program intends to involve the Jewish community in education,

advocacy and concrete action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The campaign seeks to build momentum toward Chanukah, when congregations, Jewish institutions and individuals will be asked to install energy-efficient, cost-effective compact fluorescent light bulbs.
